#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order by Chairperson NOWACZYK at 5:33pm

#### 2. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

#### 3. APPROVE THE MINUTES OF (PREVIOUS MEETING DATE) MEETING

**Motion/second** by SIPPEL/BEATTY to approve the meeting minutes from the July 23 and September 24 meeting. Motion **carried** by voice vote, no dissent.

# 4. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON WAUSAU MPO BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN 2015 MASTER PLAN UPDATE: NEW INFRASTRUCTURE RECOMMENDATIONS

The infrastructure and policy additions listed in the packet described by LYNCH. BEATTY voiced support for the loop detectors and other methods to trigger lights where they intersect with bicycle infrastructure. There was discussion regarding the addition of the River's Edge and Mall plans and how they would relate to the transportation focus of the plan. LYNCH noted that the plans would be featured in the update. ACTION: Motion to add suggested infrastructure and policy recommendations. NOWACZYK/BEATTY passed by unanimous voice vote, no dissension.

#### 5. WAUSAU MPO PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN CHANGES

LYNCH discussed the updated Wausau MPO Public Participation Plan and how it would affect the committee. Of note were the goals to have 80% attendance and representatives from traditionally underserved peoples.

#### 6. RIB MOUNTAIN TRILLIUM TRAIL OPENING

Congratulations offered to the Town of Rib Mountain on completing construction of the Trillium Trail and opening. This was a Transportation Alternative Program project that was ranked and supported by this committee and the MPO as a whole.

#### 7. WINTER BIKING PREPARATION

LYNCH provided a resource for committee members to use regarding winter biking. Committee members also recommended having a helmet with built in lights, studded tires, generator powered lights, and handlebar covers.

#### 8. COMMUNITY UPDATES AND FUTURE EVENTS

Village of Maine: Three members of the Village board and clerk are ill with COVID. MULLALY asks that everyone take caution to avoid this virus.

Rib Mountain: Clarified trail names. County R Trail is now Hummingbird Trail. Also passed ordinances that require all new commercial and apartments to have bike racks.

Wausau: After review, no changes to the e-bike ordinances. They currently reflect state law with the three classes of bikes. Upcoming discussion with Wausau Wheelers and Iron Bull on infrastructure priorities for 2021.

#### Sylvan Hill Mountain Bike Park

- 1. Sylvan Hill Phase II Plan submitted to MCPRF in July 2019.
  - a. Return trail reroute in woods. Possibly extend up on the west side of service road.
    - i. Convert old return trail to new beginner DH trail with flyover (bridge) of new return trail
- 2. Repair/rebuild Twisted Oak 2020/2021
- 3. Repair/rebuild Fish Hook 2020/2021
- 4. Armor jump lips and/or low wet spots with geopaver
- 5. Add rock tech trail and advanced b-lines in summer 2021
  - a. Initial concept from Rock Solid was \$78,525.
  - b. Request bid from Epic Trails
- 6. Add progressive dirt jump area near pump track. 2021
- 7. Additional skill zone/loop west of dirt jump area.
- 8. Other ideas:
  - a. Cap pump track with clay base material or have it paved (Pumptracks USA)
  - b. Strider pump track /smaller kids
  - c. Add extensions to Bad Rabbit and Twisted Oak. Side to side space where slope is steeper can add more turns would make trails longer or create b-lines (rock tech?)
  - d. Move open shelter at bottom of hill to top of hill by parking lot (or build new open shelter by bike parking lot).





# 5 Year Trail Plan (2020-2025) Improvements & Maintenance



**Ringle Trails** 

- 1. Add b-line side jumps Ruby Ridge (similar in style to Lost 40) 2020
- 2. Add old school rock tech line off of Rookery (volunteer) 2020
- 3. Short Round completion (Epic Trails) 2020
- 4. Rookery completion (Travis Bellman) 2020
- 5. Extend approach on advanced drops on Ruby Ridge 2020
- 6. Small jump line off of Rock the Wierzba or Ruby Ridge. 1 ft drop in, jumps range in 2-5 ft table tops.
- 7. Medium jump line in the Lost 40. Drop in 4-5 ft. jumps range from 6-8ft. Down ridge to the fun bus.
- 8. B-line on Lost 40 just above/parallel to first bigger DH section
- 9. Jump DH area between Lost 40 and Rookery
- 10. Small skills area by parking lot (west side overflow). Use recycled material from solid waste dept. (old culverts, loader tires, concrete slabs etc.)
- 11. Small pump trail loop
- 12. Alternate line off of Forest Jump (up/over boulder)

#### **Big Eau Pleine County Park**

- 1. Install wooden boardwalk in wet areas
- 2. Turnpike construction
- 3. Popcorn
  - a. Rework section just south of pond (elevate tread)
  - b. Machine build hillside just south of pond
- 4. Dharma
  - a. Machine work wet areas for drainage
  - b. Machine work southern area with slight elevation (just before Acorn loop)
- 5. Dustbowl
  - a. West end reroute for future disc golf.
  - b. Reroute wet zone (machine build/drain or move)
