<u>Discussion</u>: Action taken by the Metropolitan Planning Organization's Technical Advisory Committee (MPOTAC) recommended that the \$369,600 originally allocated to the Village of Kronenwetter be reallocated as follows: \$35,639 to the city of Schofield's West Grand Avenue project to bring that project up to 50% and reallocate the remaining \$333,961 on a percentage basis – 5.9% to each of the top 4 ranked projects and 5.85% to the West Grand Avenue project.

MPO staff will be discussing the computer modeling with WisDOT for clarification and reporting its findings back to the MPOTAC at its next meeting.

## RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2016-2019 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) FOR THE WAUSAU METROPOLITAN AREA

- WHEREAS, the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission was designated the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Wausau Urbanized Area; and
- WHEREAS, in compliance with Metropolitan Transportation Planning Regulations by the U.S. Department of Transportation, the Marathon County Conservation, Planning, and Zoning Department will develop a four-year transportation improvement program for the Wausau Metropolitan Area; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Transportation Improvement Program identifies transit, pedestrian/bicycle, and highway improvement projects and programs consistent with current transportation plans; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Transportation Improvement Program is a dynamic program and subject to amendment as needed:
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that since the approval of the 2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program for the Wausau Metropolitan Area corrections have been made to Table 1 and Table 3; these corrections should be included in the 2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program for the Wausau Metropolitan Area; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission amends the *2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program for the Wausau Metropolitan Area* to incorporate the corrected Table 1 and Table 3 as referenced on the attachment; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, in accordance with 23 CFR 450.334(a), the Wausau Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Wausau, WI urbanized area hereby certifies that the metropolitan transportation planning process is addressing the major issues facing the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable requirements of:
- 1. 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;
- 2. Sections 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
- 3. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 USC 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
- 4. 49 USC 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;

- 5. Section 1101(b) of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act of 2005, a Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) (Pub. L. 109-59) and 49 CFR Part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in the US DOT funded projects;
- 6. 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
- 7. The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 *et seq.*) and 49 CRF Parts 27, 37, and 38;
- 8. The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
- 9. Section 324 of title 23, U.S.C. regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and
- 10. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission certifies that the TIP contains only projects that are consistent with the transportation plan for the urban area and recommends that this document be submitted to the appropriate federal and state agencies for approval.



# RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE EXTENSION OF THE MOUNTAIN-BAY STATE PARK TRAIL FROM THE TRAILHEAD TO CAMP PHILLIPS ROAD IN WESTON, WISCONISN

Whereas, the Wausau Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) was created by the Federal Highway Administration to address transportation planning issues in the Wausau Metropolitan Area; and,

Whereas, the Cities of Mosinee, Schofield, Wausau, the Villages of Brokaw, Kronenwetter, Maine, Rothschild, Weston, and the Towns of Mosinee, Rib Mountain, Stettin, Wausau, and Weston, along with Marathon County and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation are members of the Wausau MPO; and,

Whereas, in September 2015, the Wausau MPO endorsed the Wausau MPO Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan that recommends biking and walking as sustainable alternative transportation methods for MPO communities to develop; and,

Whereas, community health organizations are actively promoting the use of biking and walking to improve wellness and the general health of the community; and,

Whereas, the Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan has identified this Mountain-Bay State Park Trail extension as a key component of the plan in the Village of Weston and metropolitan area; and,

Whereas, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WisDNR) has purchased the railroad rights-of-way from the Canadian National Railroad and has removed the tracks and railroad ties for the purpose of extending the Mountain-Bay State Park Trail; and,

Whereas, all of these are efforts to raise public awareness that the communities will be better places to live if more people would walk and bike to their destination, for better health, recreation, transportation, and the natural environment.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission supports and recommends that the WisDNR continue its work on extending the Mountain-Bay State Park Trail from its trailhead to Camp Phillips Road in Weston, Wisconsin; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the WisDNR work with the Marathon County Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department to develop a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to establish the process of developing, operating and maintaining the trail extension; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission supports and recommends that the WisDNR continue its work on extending the Mountain-Bay State Park Trail from its trailhead to Camp Phillips Road in Weston, Wisconsin.
