# RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE HIGHWAY SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM 2018 PERFORMANCE MEASURE TARGETS

WHEREAS, the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission was designated the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Wausau Urbanized Area; and

WHEREAS,, in accordance with 23 CFR 450.336, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation and the Wausau Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Wausau, WI urbanized area hereby certifies that the metropolitan transportation planning process is addressing the major issues in the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable requirements;

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation established five performance measures for the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) within the National Performance Management Measures: Highway Safety Improvement Program, Final (23 CFR 490, Subpart B); and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) established statewide calendar year 2018 targets for each of the five HSIP performance measures in accordance with 23 CFR 490.209; and

WHEREAS, metropolitan planning organizations must annually establish calendar year targets for each of the five HSIP performance measures by either agreeing to plan and program projects so that they contribute to the accomplishment of WisDOT's HSIP target(s) or commit to quantifiable HSIP target(s) for the metropolitan planning area; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Wausau Area MPO agrees to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishment of the WisDOT's calendar year 2018 HSIP target(s) for the following performance measures:

Number of Fatalities – 556.1 annually, Rate of Fatalities – 0.917 per 100 million vehicle miles traveled, Number of Serious Injuries – 3,023.9 annually, Rate of Serious Injuries – 4.997 per 100 million vehicle miles traveled, and Number of Non-motorized Fatalities and Non-motorized Serious Injuries – 343.3 annually; and

Application Deadline: Friday, January 26, 2018

WisDOT is preparing to accept the next round of applications for the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP). TAP is a competitively awarded grant. Eligible TAP projects must:

(1) Fit within one of the federal eligibility categories and must comply with all WisDOT TAP policies as outlined in WisDOT TAP guidelines;

(2) The project must relate to surface transportation; and

(3) The project must have an eligible sponsor.

Examples of eligible TAP infrastructure projects include sidewalks, pedestrian amenities and wayfinding, shared use paths and trails for transportation purposes, bike lanes, bike parking, bike racks on buses, bike share systems (capital costs, not operating costs), and infrastructure to improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists. Examples of TAP non-infrastructure projects include Safe Routes to School programs and City-wide, district-wide or school specific bike/pedestrian plans. **Applications are due January 26, 2018.**

The TAP application is available at the <u>WisDOT TAP website</u>. <u>The Sponsor's Guide to Non-Traditional Transportation Project Implementation</u> outlines federal and state requirements for implementing TAP and other multi-modal transportation projects. Applicants are strongly encouraged to contact WisDOT staff, particularly new participants to the TAP process with

project eligibility questions. A government unit must sponsor all TAP projects, even if the private sector is involved in the project.

WisDOT is programming this award cycle under the assumption that funding and program rules will continue as is currently established with FAST Act and the state budget level of approximately \$7.05 million annually. Projects are funded at 80% federal, with a minimum 20% required local match. A higher percentage match is permitted in a limited number of qualifying categories.
