RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE AMENDMENT TO THE 2024-2027 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE WAUSAU METROPOLITAN AREA

- **WHEREAS**, the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission was designated the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Wausau Urbanized Area; and
- WHEREAS, in compliance with Metropolitan Transportation Planning Regulations by the U.S. Department of Transportation, the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission has developed a four-year transportation improvement program (TIP) for the Wausau Metropolitan Area; and
- WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program identifies transit, pedestrian/bicycle, and highway improvement projects and programs consistent with current transportation plans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission endorses the *Long Range Transportation Plan for the Wausau Metropolitan Area* and the *Transit Development Program for the Wausau Area Transit System,* which will be continually updated and maintained as part of the urban transportation planning process;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission approves the *Pavement Replacement in the Village of Maine and Town of Texas on CTH W - Evergreen Rd to CTH WW, the Pavement Marking Project in the Villages of Rib Mountain, Rothschild, and Weston on STH 29 - I-39 to CTH D, the Spot Painting Work in the Town of Knowlton, City of Wausau, and Village of Rib Mountain on bridges B-37-146, B-37-147, B-37-362-002, B-37-360-002, and B-37-113 on I-39, USH 51, and STH 29, two Thin Polymer Overlay Projects in the Cities of Wausau and Mosinee, and the Villages of Rothschild, Rib Mountain, Kronenwetter, and Maine on bridges B-37-420, B-37-436, B-37-159, B-37-158, B-37-149, B-37-396, B-37-337, B-37-338, and B-37-339 on I-39, USH 51, and STH 29, a Reconstruction Project in the City of Wausau on US Bus. 51 from Kent St. to East Thomas St., and a Reconstruction Project in the Village of Weston on CTH X from Sternberg Ave to Eau Claire Ave, and attaches the 2024-2027 TIP Amendment Table 1 and 2 Spreadsheets* as part of this amendment to the 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program for the Wausau Metropolitan Area; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, in accordance with 23 CFR 450.336, the Wausau Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Wausau, WI urbanized area hereby certifies that the metropolitan transportation planning process is addressing the major issues facing the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance

with all applicable requirements of:

- 1. 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;
- 2. Sections 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
- 3. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 USC 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
- 4. 49 USC 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;
- Section 1101(b) of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST Act) (Pub. L. 114-357) and 49 CFR Part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in the US DOT funded projects;
- 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
- The provisions of the America ns with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) and 49 CRF Parts 27, 37, and 38;
- The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
- 9. Section 324 of title 23, U.S.C. regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and
- 10. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission certifies that the Transportation Improvement Program contains only projects that are consistent with the transportation plan for the urban area and recommends that this document be submitted to the appropriate federal and state agencies for approval.

The tables contain the basic reference data for funding awards issued to direct funding recipients in Wisconsin in CY 2022.

The purpose of the annual listing is to increase public accountability and transparency in the TIP process at the local level. The key requisite of this publication is that each obligated project listed is relevant to the MPO's local area and connected back to the TIP. This includes the funding programs used and contains a clear and transparent description of the federally funded project and includes any other relevant local project selection and TIP information to the extent practicable. The MPO worked with Metro Ride, the communities, and the state, to obtain the data for their region and present it to the public in a clear and accessible way that delivers transparency in government spending and promotes public participation in the TIP process.

The tables contain the basic reference data for funding awards issued to direct funding recipients in Wisconsin in CY 2022.

The purpose of the annual listing is to increase public accountability and transparency in the TIP process at the local level. The key requisite of this publication is that each obligated project listed is relevant to the MPO's local area and connected back to the TIP. This includes the funding programs used and contains a clear and transparent description of the federally funded project and includes any other relevant local project selection and TIP information to the extent practicable. The MPO worked with Metro Ride, the communities, and the state, to obtain the data for their region and present it to the public in a clear and accessible way that delivers transparency in government spending and promotes public participation in the TIP process.
